East European Quarterly uses the Harvard citation style (Author & Date) for references and bibliography. Below are examples that will help our authors to comply with this style

Book – one author:

1) In text citation: (Sartori 1976, p.7)

2) Bibliography:

Sartori, G., 1976. *Parties and Party Systems: A Framework for Analysis*, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press.

Book – two authors:

1) In text citation: (Bartolini & Mair 1990, pp.27–28)

2) Bibliography:

Bartolini, S. & Mair, P., 1990. *Identity, Competition, and Electoral Availability: The Stabilization of European Electorates 1885–1985*, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press.

Book – three or more authors:

1) In text citation: (Adams et al. 2005)

2) Bibliography:

Adams, J.F., Merrill III, S. & Grofman, B., 2005. *A Unified Theory of Party Competition. A Cross-National Analysis Integrating Spatial and Behavioral Factors*, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press.

Journal Article:

1) In text citation: (Hislope 1997)
